



BANKRUPTCY ASSISTANCE FOR PRO SE PARTIES

If you do not have an attorney, and you are filing or involved in a bankruptcy case in the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern District of New York, you may get information in person about the bankruptcy process and filing requirements from the Pro Se Attorney's Office.

You may be able to get help with questions like:

- What are the different bankruptcy chapters?
- What forms and schedules do I need to complete?
- What is the means test?
- How does the filing process work?
- How much does it cost to file, and what are the payment options?
- What is a 341 meeting?
- What is a discharge?
- Do I qualify for legal assistance?

Legal advice **cannot** be provided. Should you need representation, referrals can be made to a Legal Services Provider or to a Bar Association Legal Referral Service. Bankruptcy has long-term financial consequences, and it is strongly recommended that you be represented by an attorney.
