

ELECTRONIC BANKRUPTCY NOTICING (EBN)

Electronic Bankruptcy Noticing, or EBN, is a free service that allows bankruptcy notice information to be transmitted electronically to those who request it. As an alternative to receiving paper notices by regular mail, EBN allows you to choose to receive bankruptcy notice information in one of three ways:

- **Internet E-Mail** - For those who want the speed and convenience of receiving notices on-line
- **Fax** - For those who want to eliminate mail pieces, but don't want to set up an Internet E-Mail account
- **EDI** - For high-volume recipients (200 or more notices per week), EDI provides a means of automatically processing data by way of computer database to computer database transfers

EBN allows for desktop display of an entire notice for easy reading or printing, and provides considerably faster delivery of notices than does the U.S. Mail.
