For almost four decades, I have specialized in bankruptcy law and have extensive experience in the field of dispute resolution as well. I have mediated over 200 adversary proceedings of all sizes and serve on the mediation panels of the bankruptcy courts in the Eastern and Southern Districts of New York and Delaware. In addition, I have also defended and prosecuted hundreds of preference and other avoidance actions.

As a corollary, I have wide-ranging experience in all aspects of bankruptcy practice, representing creditors committees, investors, equity committees, debtors and other parties in bankruptcy courts throughout the United States.

Since 2020, I have had my own practice specializing in bankruptcy and mediation as the Law Office of Eric Haber, PLLC and also serve as in-house counsel to Wharton Property Advisors, Inc. Prior to that I was a special counsel in the Bankruptcy & Restructuring Group at Cooley LLP from 2006-2019. #### VI. Mediation Experience

I have an extensive mediation practice specializing in the area of preference and other avoidance actions as noted. Further, I have mediated hundreds of adversary proceedings and have resolved cases of all sizes seeking recoveries from \$10,000 to \$19 million in a wide variety of industries. Bankruptcies in which I have mediated adversary proceedings include Sears, Dean Foods, Fred's, Delphi Automotive Systems, WP Steel, Quebecor World (USA), Greenwich Sentry Partners, Value City Department Stores, Kodak, Greenfield Energy, Tower Manufacturing, BearingPoint, The Penn Traffic Company, Ultimate Electronics, Tweeter Electronics, MPC Computer and MAXjet Airways.

I serve on the mediation panels in the bankruptcy courts for the Southern District of New York and the District of Delaware, and have also conducted mediations for cases filed in California and Texas.

Successful mediations I have handled include:

- Resolution of preference actions seeking recovery of \$19 million and \$2.4 million when serving as mediator in the Quebecor World (USA) bankruptcy case. Mediated over 50 preference actions in the Quebecor proceeding.
- Resolution of preference actions seeking recovery of \$7.1 million and \$2.1 million when serving as mediator in the Delphi Automotive Systems bankruptcy case.
- Resolution of preference action seeking recovery of \$3.0 million when serving as mediator in the WP Steel bankruptcy case.
- Resolution of preference actions seeking recovery of \$1.7 million and \$500,000 when serving as mediator in the BearingPoint bankruptcy case.

As a result of my experience litigating preference cases, I have a deep understanding of the strategies to be employed in such litigation from a variety of different perspectives which I apply to my mediation work. For example, I represented three defendants in the Circuit City bankruptcy case in separate adversary proceedings in which the trustee sought to recover approximately \$30 million, \$11 million, and \$2.5 million. All three cases were successfully resolved at mediation.

In addition, I have taught at the American Bankruptcy Institute's Mediation Training Seminar at St. John's University. Based upon my experience as a mediator, I wrote "How to Achieve a Successful Mediation" (Legal OnRamp, 2012) In addition, I have also spoken before numerous trade groups regarding the preference laws, including the American Bankruptcy Institute, the New York Institute of Credit and the Knowledge Congress.
